RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Premiums are offered to bona fide members of a 4-H Club or FFA Chapter, from the following towns: Alva, Freedom, Waynoka and Aline-Cleo and schools in the counties of Beaver, Cimarron, Dewey, Ellis, Harper, Roger Mills, Texas, and Woodward. FFA Chapters or 4-H Families exhibiting animals at any other 2024 district livestock show will be ineligible to exhibit at the Woodward District Junior Livestock Show. Exhibitors must be academically eligible in order to show or sale as determined by exhibitor's school and/or the OSSAA. Ineligible exhibitors and their animals can not show or be exhibited. **An exhibitor who is 8-years-old and in the 3rd grade by September 1, 2023, must be enrolled in 4-H prior to OYE in order to compete. If a child turns 9, by September 1, 2023, they are eligible to show at OYE, regardless of their grade level. OYE follows the same age requirements as the enrollment guidelines of Oklahoma 4-H.**
2. Rules and Regulations governing the Oklahoma Youth Expo (OYE) will be followed at the Woodward District Livestock Show unless stated otherwise. Announcements made prior to and during the Woodward District Junior Livestock Show will supersede this publication.
3. **Stall fees are \$35 on goats, sheep & hogs, and \$45 on steers and heifers.** Entries are to be postmarked by Friday, February 2nd to the Woodward Chamber of Commerce. Checks accepted from FFA Chapter or OSU Extension Center. All exhibits entry information is to be provided electronically on the form provided, except weight. Exhibitor may make a breed change upon arrival within a species. Late entries will be accepted for an additional \$10 per entry and will be accepted until Tuesday, February 6th. Entry form available at: www.woodwardchamber.com. Stalling will be done with entries received on **2/2, February 17th**. One Extension Educator, Ag ED Instructor or leader from each county or chapter will pick up all entry cards and once entry packets have been picked up no changes may be made to the number of cards you have been issued. Photocopy of pseudorabies test report must be provided to show officials to receive entry packet.
5. Pens and stall space will be assigned in all barns. No cattle grooming chutes or equipment allowed in any of the aisles. Electric generators must be operated outside of the barns. Exhibitors must furnish their own bedding. Only wood chips may be used in barns, no straw, no tie-outs. Each exhibitor is expected to have

pens and alleys clean at all times. There will be absolutely no feeding or watering in the alley. No feeding or bedding down of exhibits outside the fenced area or in trailers.

6. Exhibits must be in place when entry cards are due or weigh-in begins and remain on the grounds until released after showing.
7. Not more than a total of 3 steers, 2 heifers, 3 barrows, 3 gilts, 3 wether goats, 3 doe goats, and 3 wether lambs and 3 ewes can be exhibited by any one exhibitor. Exhibitors are expected to accompany their livestock to the show, care for them, and exhibit them, but in case of sickness or other conditions making this impossible, their animal may be shown by another club or chapter member from the same club or chapter, if that's not possible then someone from your county, by special permission of the show officials.
8. All animals, with the exception of heifers and purebred ewes must be nominated for OYE in order to participate in the 2024 Woodward District Junior Livestock Show. All animals must have OYE tag placed in ear. Steers will be shown as English (with no breed divisions or recognitions Angus, Hereford, Shorthorn), black (ANY amount of black) cross and all other colored cross. Any divisions with ten or more steers in it has their champion and reserve in the sale. ALL animals must be entered in the breed in which they were nominated, with the exception of wether lambs, which will be shown in breeds determined by the classifier.
9. Livestock Show Executive Committee will determine what breeds will be shown within a species. In most cases, the recognized breeds at the OYE will be shown. Barrows will be shown as light and dark crosses. There will be no Hereford barrows shown as their own breed, they will be allowed only in the crossbred division.
10. District show animals will be weighed one time only during weigh-back. Steers and Commercial Heifers will have an official weigh-in procedure and not be weighed back during class. In each species the top end of each class will be weighed by Superintendents. Swine will be weighed in the show ring prior to placing.
 11. Schools or individuals parking livestock trailers, even if they are hooked up to a pickup, in restricted areas are subject to being disqualified from show, forfeiting premium money, and awards. **You may enter south side of the barns from the east gate only and exit from the west gate only.** The gates providing access to the south side of the barns will be locked at various times as determined by show officials to provide safety for exhibitors and livestock. Vehicles must be removed from the area upon request of the show officials.
 12. Premiums paid on number of exhibits in the class will be as determined by the show officials.

13. Animals, which in the opinion of the superintendents that do not meet the breed characteristics in the class shown will be moved to the crossbred division.
14. Sheep and Wether lambs and barrows will be shown following the OYE format. Hair sheep will not be broken by breed, but shown together and will follow the same rules as wether lambs. A breed must have (4) or more exhibits in order for that breed to have its own breed show. Any breed of wether lambs with less than (4) head will have exhibits moved to crossbred class. If a breed has six in it, they will be guarantee a spot in the sale.
15. Breeding doe goats will only have one division and they will not be allowed to brace. Classes will be made for all species of females with four or more in their breed. If four females are not in a breed they will move to AOB. If they do not have four AOB, they will be moved to commercial. Registered females will show by birth date listed on registration certificate. Commercial females will be shown by weight. Registration papers must be provided for purebred stock, copies and faxes are accepted but electronic copies are not.
16. Any protest must be in writing and submitted to the show co-chairmen or show officials accompanied with a \$500.00 cash non-refundable deposit.
17. Issues arising, not covered by the rules shall be decided by a committee consisting of the Livestock Show Executive Committee.
18. In no case will the Chamber of Commerce or its agents or representatives, the Woodward County Fair Board or any member of the Livestock Show Committee be responsible for any accident or loss that may occur to the exhibitor, his or her exhibit or other spectators.
19. No one but the exhibitor will be allowed ring side or behind the holding pens during the show or sale line up. There will be a designated area for the above mentioned individuals that will not go beyond the make up arena.
20. Violation of any rule(s) will be immediate disqualification for the exhibitor and a forfeit of any premiums or awards for any of his or her animals shown or to be shown.

LAMB LEAD CONTEST

Objective: To present the participant and animal in the most attractive manner possible, to promote the use of wool in apparel, and to improve the image of the lamb show.

1. Each contestant must complete an entry form and submit it to the Ellis County OSU Extension Center no later than 5:00pm on Friday, February 2nd, 2024. No late entries will be accepted after this date.

PREMIUM SALE:

1. All Grand Champions and Reserve Grand Champions will automatically be in the sale even if an exhibitor has more than one that qualifies. Otherwise an exhibitor can have only one livestock exhibit in the Premium Sale. Exhibits in the premium sale will be dictated by placement in predetermined Sale Order.

A total of ninety-eight (98) animals will qualify for the Premium Sale: Priority for sale line up will be beef, hogs, then the highest populated species shown for the 2024 show.

A. Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Breeding Gilts, Breeding Does, Ewes, and Supreme and Reserve Supreme Heifers

B. A total of forty (41) barrows, seventeen (17) wether goats, seventeen (17) wether lambs, and fifteen (15) steers

2. All market barrows will qualify their breed champion for the Premium Sale. The only reason a barrow breed champion would not be in the sale is because the exhibitor has a livestock exhibit determined to be higher in the Sale Order. A reserve breed champion barrow is not guaranteed a slot in the Premium Sale if the breed champion is not put into the Sale Order due to an exhibitor having a livestock exhibit higher in the Sale Order. The remaining slots in the Sale Order for barrows will be filled according to the formula based upon a percentage that takes into account the number of exhibits within the breed. Larger numbered breeds will have more exhibits in the Premium Sale compared to breeds with a small number of exhibits with the numbers mentioned being maximum number allowed into the sale.

3. After the selection of Grand and Reserve Grand steer, divisions meeting the requirement of (10) steers will have their champions and reserves champions chosen for sale order. Divisions with nine or less will then compete with the remaining steers for the balance of the 15 slots based on merit. Following the selection of the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Lamb. Champions of breeds with 6 or more will be lined up in sale order. After the selection of the lamb breeds meeting the requirement of (6) lambs, champions from the breeds with five or less along with the remaining reserve breed champions will compete for the remaining slots toward the balance of (15) lambs making the premium sale based on merit. These remaining slots in the Premium Sale will be determined strictly on merit with no guarantee that a breed will have its breed champion as a representative in the sale.

4. Following the selection of the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion on wether goat, each division champion will return for Sale Order line up by the judge. After lining up division champions the remaining slots will be filled based upon merit only.

5. All premium sale animals must have OYE ear tag in place in order to be sold. Any animal in question will be DNA or ear notch verified.

6. ALL exhibitors are responsible for getting their animal to the ring in ample time for the sale order line up. The exhibitor will be called over the sound system three times, after the third time the exhibitor will not be allowed to show in the sale order line up, and all premiums will be forfeited.

7. All premium sale exhibitors must take a picture with their buyer, if no picture, then no money will be paid out to the exhibitor from the premium sale.
